II. MOH Measures

At present, due to the threat of Omicron variant strains, Brunei has adjusted its entry policy as follows:

1. The Brunei Epidemic Steering Committee has agreed to temporarily remove all countries from the tourism green list. Therefore, starting from January 1, 2022, no country will be on the previously announced green list.

2. Before entering Brunei, everyone must undergo a nucleic acid test 48 hours before leaving the country, without the need for rapid antigen test (ART).

3. All immigrants are required to undergo compulsory self-isolation at the designated hotel after entry, must undergo ART test at the airport immediately after entry, and undergo nucleic acid test at RIPAS Hospital SPOC on the 5th day after entry.

4. Brunei citizens and permanent residents who have received two doses of the vaccine within 14 days to 3 months or vaccinated with booster injections are allowed to leave the country for essential business. Staff members who have been injected over 3 months ago but who have not received booster jab are not allowed to leave Brunei.

5. Foreigners entering Brunei for work or other reasons still need to obtain entry permits, while those leaving the country also need to obtain exit permits. The above approval can be applied for on the PMO website.

Curfew policy has been extended to 14 Feb, where going out during 0:00 am and 4:00 am is forbidden.

III. Company Covid Prevention

1. Company publicity

1.1 Company's epidemic prevention policy: All employees must strictly abide by the company's epidemic prevention regulations. If they really need to go out, they must ask for leave from their HOD, take protective measures, and strictly implement the registration and reporting system.

1.2 Company underlies that only those holding Green or Yellow Code are allowed to go to work. Those with Red Code are forbidden to go out, including those who will arrive on 17 Sept. Fake or outdated Green Code is extremely forbidden. Fresh real-time shoud be showed to those who access the PMB bridge.

1.3 employees are expected to learn how to use BruHealth App, update their info on a daily basis. Avoid mistakes in updating the app.

2. Logistics support

2.1 Office Area: routine disinfection in offices, vehicles each day going normal.

2.2 Wecare online delivers grocery to PMB every Friday.

3. Health monitoring and medical care services

3.1 HSE Dept checks temperature and mask-up compliance everyday.

3.2 HSE department has set up fixed temperature detection points at the K1 gate of West Tank Farm and the C1 gate of the main plant area to monitor the body temperature of personnel entering the plant before 7 am and after 9 pm every day. The K1 gate of the West Tank District includes body temperature monitoring of BSM tank truck drivers, and all units are required to cooperate fully in the implementation of epidemic prevention.

IV. CEO Instructions on COVID Prevention

In view of the spread of Omicron in the community, educate all employees to strengthen precautions, pay attention to disinfection of outsourced items, maintain a safe distance from proprietary contractor personnel, and avoid public places. All departments should pay attention to controlling gatherings, especially not going to outside restaurants. Each functional department strengthened the epidemic prevention inspection of contractors within its own functional scope. From this week, ART screening for all staff will be adjusted to once a week.
